Professor Raymond Parsons

Professor Raymond Parsons, prominent SA economist, teaches at the Department of Economic and Management Sciences at the University of Pretoria. He is a key contributor to public and academic debate on a broad spectrum of issues of critical importance to the political economy of SA. He is a recognised authority on the SA economy and its implications for the business community. He studied economics at the Universities of Cape Town, Oxford and Copenhagen, before playing a leading role in organised business in SA for many years. Professor Parsons is a former Director-General of the SA Chamber of Business (SACOB). He is currently the Overall Business Convenor in NEDLAC and until recently was a Visiting Professor at the School of Economic and Business Sciences at Wits University. He is also an Honorary Professor in the Department of Economics and Economic History at the University of Port Elizabeth and a Vice- President of the Economic Society of South Africa. Member, Governing Council of Cranefield College for Project and Strategic Management. He is the author/editor of three recent books - *The Mbeki Inheritance: SA's Economy 1990-2004*, *Parsons' Perspective - Focus on the Economy*, and *Manuel, Markets and Money - Essays in Appraisal*. He has received a honorary doctorate from the University of Port Elizabeth (1997) and the Order for Meritorious Service by the State President for outstanding service in the general public interest (1993).
